### Spelling Bee




She loves playing racquetball and going hiking for exercise. Among her interests are quilting, oil painting landscapes, talking with people, and camping.

## World Language

Welcome back parents! We are approaching the end of the second term.Before the break 2nd grade had their World language Wonderday. It was an amazing time to explore other cultures and how they celebrate holidays. The kids had a blast learning about La Befana (Italy), St. Lucia (Sweden) and writing a letter to Santa (Greenland).



Exciting things are happening in Arabic! Natakallam, a non-profit that connects Syrian refugees with Arabic learners, granted us a full-scholarship for our Middle School Arabic classes to Skype with a Syrian refugee and practice their Arabic as a class for 9 sessions. Our class speaking partner is a 25 year-old Syrian living in Germany where she just got accepted to complete her Bachelor's degree in English. We are looking forward to connecting with her and further humanizing the culture and language for our students!

1st Year Arabic classes have been learning and flourishing with the basics: getting-to-know-you, items around the classroom, numbers, animals, and hobbies! While 5th Grade recently presented some amazing family posters, and Middle School has been pushing their Arabic abilities using a curriculum similar to BYU's Arabic program. All Arabic classes enjoyed their second-annual holiday henna activities, where students learned about the tradition and art of henna and get their very own! # Reading Corner

One good strategy for helping our students to become more fluent in their reading, is re-reading. If a student is struggling with a piece of reading, have them re-read it out loud a couple of times. Make sure they understand the meaning of any word they mispronounce, or try to skip over altogether.

When learning to play basketball, one must practice foul shots repeatedly. If one wants to become good at playing the piano, they must practice the same tune again and again to master the piece. Reading gets better with practice, as well. When your students are doing their daily reading practice at home, get involved. Have them read aloud and listen to them...take turns reading pages with them. Ask them to tell you about the story. Engaging with your children in their reading, will help them to be better readers and will also help them see the importance that your family places on reading.
