Message from the Dean

Renaissance Families,

Welcome back for another month full of learning and fun in November! Check out some important reminders and information below. Feel free to reach out at savery@renacademy.org or contact your students teachers directly anytime if you have questions or concerns about our school.

1. COVID Update - Wednesday, November 11th

To keep all stakeholders informed, I have included our current RA COVID statistics below. I am communicating as quickly as possible with all families and staff when I hear that your children have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, either on-campus or outside of school. Thank you for all you are doing to help your children stay in school, coordinate with teachers to keep up on missed work while they are in quarantine, and communicate to let us know when they have been exposed to COVID outside of school. Our goal at Renaissance is to stay open as long as possible and to keep educating your children both on-campus and online.

Staff/student positive test results in the last two weeks (10/27-11/11) - 1x student/staff

Students/staff quarantined due to exposure off-campus to someone who has tested positive for COVID (11/11) - 24x students/staff

2. Masks at School - Please double check your student has a clean mask on when you drop them off!

As we know, all students, parents and staff are required to wear a mask when they are inside the school building. Thank you for your cooperation and diligence in helping your students remember to wear and bring their masks to school. I have been so impressed with how well each student has handled wearing a mask while on-campus! We barely have to remind our students they are such pros!

However, we are starting to go through a lot of disposable masks in the front office when students forget to bring them to school. Please ensure your student/s have multiple cloth masks, and bring a new clean mask to school to wear every day. Thank you for your support and help to keep our school open!

3. AAPPL Testing - November 9th - December 11th (3rd-8th Chinese Immersion Students

Our Chinese Immersion students in 3rd-8th grade are in the process of completing their state required language proficiency assessment AAPPL (ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages) over the next few weeks. The AAPPL test assesses student Mandarin language proficiency, including speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. Various skills are tested in different grades. Our on-campus hybrid students will complete this assessment when they are at school. Full-time online Chinese DLI students will complete the assessments online at home.

Your students Chinese teacher should have sent home a schedule of when your child will be testing. As much as possible, please try to ensure they are at school on those days and not checked out for any appointments etc. It makes it extremely challenging for teachers to coordinate make-up tests for students if they are absent. If for some reason your student is required to quarantine during the AAPPL testing window, their Chinese teacher and I will coordinate to move their test to 'at-home testing mode' and they will be able to complete it online from home. Please reach out to your child's Chinese teacher directly with any specific questions about AAPPL testing.

4. How to check your students grades and missing working on Aspire

You can easily check your students academic progress and grades online through our student information system Aspire. We encourage you to be involved in your students' education and to learn and to check aspire regularly/ at least weekly. Please contact your students teacher if you are struggling to access your students grades through Aspire.

To create a login for your student:

- a) Click on the link https://renaissance.usoe-dcs. org/Login.aspx
- b) Click on 'Request a Username'
- c) Enter your student ID number (same as their lunch number and can be obtained from their classroom teacher), date of birth and then create an account
- d) Check your students grades and missing work regularly

5. Lost & Found

Just a reminder to please mark all student sweaters, jackets, lunch boxes, and other personal belongings with your student's name. This makes it easier to find the owners and prevents you having to re-purchase lost items. Lost and found items are regularly placed in the gym and will be kept for one week before they are donated. 


Battle of the Books- Volunteers needed


Aquarium Visit-2nd Grade


Halloween Monster Mash


Online Teachers
