School Lunch Reminder

Important Reminder: As we're heading towards the last 2 months of school please keep a close eye on your students account balance. During the last month of the school year in May, students with a delinquent account of any amount will be given an emergency meal until payment is made in full as stated in our School Meal Payment Policy. All accounts with negative balances are expected to be paid off the last day of the school year.

We're testing out a monthly survey. You can fill out the survey one week at a time or for the entire month. If you are filling out for the entire month do not submit a survey every week. Please mark hot lunch or PB&J for the days you want your student to each school lunch. Fridays are a sack lunch, when you select hot it's for the turkey, ham & cheese sandwich or there's also PB&J. You can skip the days you do not need a school lunch.

With this new implementation it's important to keep in mind and be considerate that due to labor constraints, food availability and our food delivery schedule, school meals are required to still be ordered by the Friday before. We'll be pulling the lunch participation report every Friday so we can order for the following Monday. We get our food delivery truck on Mondays for that entire week's menu. We keep PB&J sandwiches in stock however since the hot lunch varies daily we only have so much freezer space for storage when considering how much extra we can have on hand.

Lunch is \$2.85. You must fill out a survey for each student individually.

Breakfast is served every school day for \$1.75 from 7:40-7:55. Please bring your students on time they need to be done eating by 7:55. There's PE at 8 and we have to clean and put tables away for class. There's no need to fill out a survey for breakfast as we have a small number of students coming for breakfast.


