1. <u>Returning Student Enrollment</u> - Please re-enroll your returning students as soon as possible for the 2020-2021 school year!

We are beginning our re-enrollment and lottery process for the 2020-2021 school year. In order for us to determine how many positions will be available in the upcoming lottery, all current Renaissance Academy students are required to confirm their enrollment for the next school year by completing an online re-enrollment process. Re-enrollment of your student will ensure that their spot is not released and offered to a new applicant through the lottery held on a date to be determined in March. Occupation: Civil Rights Leader

Born: January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, GA Died: April 4, 1968 in Memphis, TN

- * King was the youngest person to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964.
- * At the Atlanta premier of the movie Gone with the Wind, Martin sang with his church choir.
- * There are over 730 streets in the United States named after Martin Luther King, Jr.

In his first major civil rights action, Martin Luther King, Jr. led the Montgomery Bus Boycott. This started when Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a bus to a white man. Because of the boycott (which lasted over a year), segregation on buses came to an end!

This year for MLK Day (January 20), we challenge you to do a bit of service in memory of this great man who gave everything to make a difference.
