We do not close the school for snow days. We are always open and we trust parents to make good decisions. School Lunch Reminder

Important: A tab was added to the main school website page renacademy.org for easy access under Lunch Order Form next to the Menus.

You can fill out the survey a week at a time or for the entire month using the same link. Please mark hot lunch or PB&J for the days you want your student to eat school lunch. Fridays are a sack lunch, when you select hot it's for the turkey, ham & cheese sandwich or there's also PB&J. You can skip the days you do not need a school lunch.

With this new implementation it's important to keep in mind and be considerate that due to labor constraints, food availability and our food delivery schedule, school meals are required to still be ordered by the Friday before. We will be pulling the lunch participation report every Friday so we can order for the following Monday. We get our food delivery truck on Mondays for that entire week's menu. We keep PB&J sandwiches in stock however since the hot lunch varies daily we only have so much freezer space for storage when considering how much extra we can have on hand.

Lunch is \$2.85. You must fill out a survey for each student individually.

Breakfast is served every school day for \$1.75 from 7:40-7:55. Please bring your students on time they need to be done eating by 7:55. There's PE at 8 and we have to clean and put tables away for class. There is no need to fill out a survey for breakfast as we have a small amount of students coming for breakfast.



Did you know that Renaissance Academy offers the Chinese Immersion program in middle school?

In middle school, Chinese program looks very different from elementary schools' 50/50 mode, or 6th grade's Chinese and social study classes. When your students go to DLI in middle school, they will take DLI 3 - DLI 5 classes from 7th grade to 9th grade as their required Chinese language class. They also have the opportunity to take Chinese Culture class as an elective. In 9th grade, students have the option to participate in the AP Chinese Language and Culture test, and we offer AP Prep class as an elective for 9th grade students who are planning to take the

Reasons that parents choose the middle school DLI program at Renaissance Academy:











- Chinese 3-5 classes are NOT equal to DLI 3-5 classes. In the DLI 3 class, your student's classmates are from the DLI program, and have learned Chinese in the past 6 years. However, in the Chinese 3 class, your student's classmates are students who started to learn Chinese in Chinese 1 and only have 2-year experience in learning this language. This will directly lead to a situation that the class content might be too easy for students who come from the DLI path and you won't see improvement in their language skills from that class.
- The Utah DLI program requires to use simplified Chinese characters, while many of the non-DLI programs use traditional Chinese characters. DLI students will confront with many struggles when they read and write in a new character system, and lost their confidence and interest in learning Chinese, especially when student comes from a non-Chinese speaking background.
- Our class sizes in middle school is smaller than district schools, which makes the differentiation in the classrooms a lot easier and your students have a lot more opportunities to receive individual feedback and support from teachers.
- Besides the required Chinese language classes, MS students can also take the Chinese culture class, which helps them to enrich the knowledge of Chinese culture and better equip them for the AP Chinese test. Students have more class time to practice their language skills in the school day by taking the Chinese culture elective.
- At Renaissance Academy, all Chinese teachers are native mandarin speakers from mainland China and Taiwan. The majority of them have master's degrees in education and many years of teaching experience in the US. We take good care of every student in our program and we work together as a team.

SPANISH - Senora Beebe












We are also learning more fun facts about the Middle Eastern countries. Students are making connections and comparisons between different cultures.

What is your favorite thing about teaching? My favorite thing about teaching is approaching teaching like a puzzle. I love filling in the missing pieces and see-


ing the joy that students have when something clicks into place.


