

Fantastic New Instructor



Learning about wasps in Jr. Academy
Last week, Jr. Academy students were "bugged" by a wasp! It was found outside the east doors when coming in from recess and made things a bit tense for some. The wasp was ushered on to "The Big Wasp Nest in the Sky" and what was once just an event, became a daily study for students!

We studied and watched wasp videos - did you know there are over 30,000 kinds of wasps? We moved about the room like wasps (during which Ms. Hooker was stung several times!) We discussed the wasps body is that of an insect - with a head, thorax, and abdomen as well as six leas, and an exoskeleton. (We will learn more about insects later this year.) Students even created play-doh models of a wasp body. It was a great learning experience! Be sure to ask your student which wasp has the stinger - the male or the female!! :)



Students can turn labels into their teacher or to Mr. Wright in the Library.


