Suicide Prevention

Friday 4/17 from 2:00 -3:00 PM

Childhood and adolescence can be a wonderful and rewarding time for many young people, but for some, it can also be emotionally difficult. Suicide has become a major public health concern in the state of Utah. It is the 2nd leading cause of death for ages 10 - 17, and is devastating to families and communities. One of our best strategies for suicide prevention is education.

This week Renaissance Academy is offering a seminar to educate community members on depression and suicidal behaviors. We encourage and ask all parents, if you can be available, to attend the seminar. Greg Hudnall, the Executive Director of Hope4Utah, will present this seminar for parents and faculty members. Greg has over 20 years of experience in suicide prevention, and he delivers a powerful and informative message. The seminar will take place on Friday, April 17th from 2:00 - 3:00 pm in the Rousseau Room, and will address the following:


Dear parents,

RENAISSANCE ACADEMY SCHOOL DANCE (80s Dance April 24th) PERMISSION FORM AND GUIDELINES

Students and their guests are expected to obey all school and dance rules. The dance rules are as follows:

- Students are not to arrive before 6:45 p.m.
- The uniform dress code is not in effect for the dance. Students are encouraged to wear their best 80s Attire. (See costume guidelines below)
- Students are to remain in the gym during the dance.
- No outside food or drink will be allowed in the gym
- Bathrooms are to be used for their intended purposes. Students are not to spend the evening in them.
- Students are to treat all teachers and parent chaperones courteously and follow the instructions they are given.
- Students are to stay in the building until their ride is in the parking lot. They may not leave and reenter the building.
- If a student brings an approved guest to the dance, that student is to see that the guest knows and obeys all Renaissance Academy school and dance rules. The student must complete a request form (available in the office) and obtain approval by the day prior to the dance.
- The dance ends at 9:00 p.m. Any student not picked up by 9:15 p.m. will not be allowed to attend the next dance

RULES FOR DANCING:

- Students are to dance face-to-face or side-to-side. Students are not to dance front to back.
- During slow dances, there is to be visible space between dancers.

COSTUME GUIDELINES:

- No low cut or short costumes
- No revealing costumes
- No masks
- No weapons
- No overly gruesome makeup

Students who are in violation of these rules will receive one warning from a chaperone, teacher, or administrator. Students who continue to misbehave will be taken to a teacher or an administrator and may be instructed to sit for a short time, asked to call a parent/guardian to pick them up, or told they are not allowed to attend the next dance.
