ALEKS & Imagine Learning

This year we have received two grants for wonderful, adaptive math and reading programs that are available for use at home:

ALEKS is a math program for grades 3-9 which uses adaptive questioning to determine exactly what a student knows, then instructs the them on the topics they are most ready to learn. As a student works through a course, ALEKS periodically reassesses them to ensure that topics learned are retained. ALEKS is a supplemental program we are using in addition to the My Math & Glencoe Math Curriculum followed by homeroom and math teachers and is meant to fill gaps or challenge those ready for more.

Imagine Learning is an adaptive reading program for grades k-3 in which students are given lessons geared to their individual skill level. The program incorporates the five essential components of reading: phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension, along with reading strategies, grammar, spelling, word recognition and much more. Lexile levels are assessed regularly and you student will receive guidance tailored to their current readiness level. Imagine Learning is a supplemental program used in addition to the Treasures English & Language Arts program used daily by homeroom teachers at RA.

We love how these programs pinpoint exactly where kids are at and what they may be struggling with. This data is valuable for teachers and parents so they know what individualized instruction is needed. Both programs can be accessed through computers, iPads, or Chromebooks, and are meant to be used 15-20 minutes daily (at home or at school) with a minimum of 60 minutes per week. If your student is using either program at home, we ask that you please do not assist them in answering questions as it may affect the level of material they are presented with and could move them to lessons that are above their current readiness level. To access reports about what your student has mastered or needs more help with, for current Lexile levels to assist in finding proper reading materials for your child, or for questions regarding your child's login information, please contact me or their classroom teacher. I am available to answer any additional questions you may have regarding these or other programs used at Renaissance Academy any time.
